Reminders

- -While we understand that many parents would like their children to wear a smartwatch, we are seeking your cooperation in supporting <u>Closter Board of Education Policy 5516</u>, which indicates appropriate use of an electronic device during the school day.

The use of smartwatches and other electronic devices is very distracting to the learning environment, and it is the district's policy that all devices with the capability to audio or video record must be turned off during the school day. If the smartwatch is capable of making and/or receiving phone calls and/or text messaging, these features should not be utilized at all during the school day. Parents must not call or text students at any time while school is in session. If you need to communicate with your child, you must call the school office at (201) 768-3860, extension 41127.

Please understand that if this policy is violated, your child(ren)'s smartwatch will be confiscated, and a parent will be required to pick it up from the office.

We would appreciate your conversing with your child(ren) regarding the appropriate use of such devices. With your help, we will succeed in making the students' time in Closter Schools a rewarding learning experience for all.
