Download & Log In Instructions



Take Note

Safety

Let's work together to ensure a safe arrival and dismissal for everyone. Reminders:

• When dropping off and picking up students in our active driveways, drivers must remain in their vehicles. If you need to exit your vehicle to assist your child, do not use the drop-off/pick-up line. Park in a designated parking spot. (Kindergarten and Grade One students are dismissed directly to an adult. Parents should park and walk to pick up their child.)

- Students should enter and exit vehicles from the passenger side only.
- Do not double park or block crosswalks.
- The front parking lot to the right of the gym, designated as STAFF ONLY, is **not** a drop-off and pick-up area. Parents are not permitted to use this parking lot for dropping off or picking up children.
- Plan ahead! Arriving late not only impacts your child's instructional time but also disrupts that of their classmates. Students must arrive before 8:40 a.m.
- When arriving early to pick up students, turn your car engine off. Cars should not be left idling.
- Families are encouraged to walk, ride bikes, or park at Closter Commons.
- Follow the instructions from our staff and the Closter Police.

Test Talk

Throughout the school year, Hillside School conducts a variety of standardized and benchmark assessments to help monitor and support student learning. These assessments are administered at different times and grade levels, and families will always receive a letter prior to any testing. Below is an overview of the key assessments your child may participate in during the year, as outlined in our 2025–26 Standardized Assessment Information

- LinkIt (Benchmark Testing ELA & Math)
 Administered in grades 2–8, three times per year (September, January, and June). These assessments help track student progress and guide instruction.
- Aimsweb (Benchmark Testing Literacy & Numeracy)
 Administered in grades K & 1, twice a year (September and February), to assess foundational skills in reading and math.
- NJSLA (New Jersey Student Learning Assessment)
 State-mandated testing in ELA and Math for grades 3-8, and in Science for grades 5 & 8.
 Testing takes place in May, and score reports are sent home in September.
- WIDA ACCESS for ELLs
 Required state assessment for students identified as multilingual learners in grades K-8, even if they have opted out of ESL services. This test evaluates skills in listening, speaking, reading,

and writing, and is administered between February and March. Score reports are sent home in July.

CogAT (Cognitive Abilities Test)
 Administered in grades 2 and 4, as well as to new-to-district students in grades 3, 5, 6, and 7.
 The CogAT measures verbal, nonverbal, and quantitative reasoning and is used as part of the eligibility process for our enrichment program. Testing occurs in March.

You already received a letter detailing all the testing taking place this fall, but just as a reminder - LinkIt and Aimsweb assessments are taking place this month in our classrooms.

- Students in grades 2–4 took the LinkIt Math benchmark during the week of September 15, and the ELA benchmark during the week of September 22.
- Aimsweb testing for students in grades K-1, and DIBELS testing for grades 2-3, are being conducted between now and October.

These assessments help us better understand student progress and guide instruction throughout the school year.
